including one written by (pictured right) Joy Farrington (who attended the presentation) – *This is the land Australia*; a medley of advertising jingles from way back, including the Vegemite song, Aeroplane Jelly and Brylcreem; and finishing with *The Song of Australia*; one which many of us remembered and were able to join in with gusto.

Diane Anderson on behalf of the Street Party Committee then spoke about the wonderful incentives undertaken by various groups throughout the community in the past year including the hugely successful Community Dinners, which take place from around 6pm on the last Sunday of every month. These have not only brought our community closer together by connecting community members, but they have also raised thousands of dollars to contribute to the upgrading of the Talunga Park clubrooms kitchen –

a great community asset and one which is utilised many time throughout the year for various functions. Diane also mentioned the annual Street Party (see newsletter #7 for pictures), the Talunga Park and Soldier's Memorial Hall committees which have transitioned from committees to volunteer groups under the aegis of the new Mount Pleasant Business and Tourism Association, which will be working with these and other groups towards the smooth running and promotion of Mount Pleasant as a force to be reckoned with. Watch this space! The Mount Pleasant Show continues to be one of the most popular shows in country South Australia, and last year was no exception. Diane also mentioned the contribution of the CFS, which is an invaluable and necessary community resource, and made mention of the Cadet programme, which encourages our young citizens to be involved in their community.



The Bowling Club has also had a very successful year, as has the Red Cross (don't forget the Garden Party in February!), and the two arms of the CWA – the day group, and the night group, which caters for those who have other commitments during the daytime. The Friends of the Mount Pleasant Hospital also make a wonderful and much appreciated contribution to our community, and we would be the poorer for their absence. Special mention was made of the group of volunteers who run the History Room and the brilliant display during History month in May which carried on after the hugely

To that end, The Quiet Achiever Award was presented to David Kroehn for his tireless efforts in many organisations within the community.

The Mount Pleasant Farmers Market ended 2015 with a bang by smashing all records for stallholder and patron attendance at their annual Christmas Twilight Market in December. Many more events are planned for the year ahead. Market Manager Genevieve Hebart says they are looking forward to continued success in 2016, and that Staff and volunteers are still busy putting the final touches on many of the events. The Market will celebrate its 4<sup>th</sup> birthday on **Saturday, 6<sup>th</sup> February**. In four years, the Market has grown to over 50 registered stallholders and nearly 600 active members; it welcomes a steady stream of loyal shoppers through the gates every Saturday and has raised almost \$40,000 for community groups through the on-site gold coin parking donations. ## CWA celebrations

The Mount Pleasant branch was formed on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 1935, when Mrs Dolling (State Secretary), Mrs P.A. Ohlshom (State Treasurer), Mrs N. Twiss and Mrs F.B. Cundell attended. On February 1936, 66 members were present with 12 new members enrolled, and the membership fee was 3 shillings.

Early meetings were held in a small shed near the present Tennis Courts and the present Rest Room was first used in July 1939. The war years saw much activity with members making hundreds of bottles of jam and knitting many garments for the services. In 1941 the tea Rooms at the sale yard were taken over and in the intervening years have remained our main source of income, although stock sales are now only held once or twice a month.



On the 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2015, The Mount Pleasant Soldier's Memorial Hall was the venue for our 80<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations. About 59 ladies attended the celebrations, including the State president Mrs Linda, Bertram, Group President Janelle Traeger and Group Secretary Helen Hogg. Other visitors joined members from the Mount Pleasant Branch including members from The Hills and Murray Group Branch, Gawler Branch members and other people from our community. The hall was decorated in red and white balloons with displays of a Minute book, photos of past and present members, certificates, trophies and handicrafts. It was also Melbourne Cup Day and there were prizes for Best Hat and Fascinator. Everyone took part in the Melbourne Cup Day race, with lots of laughter and friendship.



Our President Mrs Di Anderson welcomed members and visitors to our 80<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebrations, then gave a brief talk on the formation and activities of our branch, There was a special

mention of Mrs Hazel Wilton who is our longest serving member, but who was unfortunately unable to attend.

Mr Trevor Anderson from the local Landmark branch – Anderson and Fawcett – spoke about the branch at the saleyards and about how the tea rooms of today is a much more modern and practical facility than it was in 1941, when it was an old shed with no mod cons – only having a wood stove, a copper for hot water, and an old bath to keep drinks cool. Upon closing he congratulated the branch for it's ongoing service to the market, and for reaching the 80 year milestone, before declaring the day open.

After lunch the ceremonial cake – made by Mrs Mary Starkey - was cut and enjoyed by all.

Our day was a memorable one, knowing past members paved the way for our branch. Our branch has proudly been



able to support many organisations in the community, including the Mount Pleasant History Room, Primary School, Scouts, Hospital, C.F.S and Soldier's Memorial Hall, as well as the SACWA projects and funds (Sampson Flat & Eden Valley fires, droughts, and many other disasters) that have needed a helping hand. One special donation was given to the ACWWA – Nepal fund. This was donated in mind to remember Mrs E Morgan, who was an active member of the ACWWA, and also the sister of our member Hazel Wilton.

A very happy day concluded with the 'Song of Peace', and our president thanked everyone who came, and wished them a safe journey home.

# Uncovering Mount Pleasant's past – Chemists

Many of us are familiar with the Chemist Shop, which now exists between Melrose Street and Herriot Road, almost opposite the Mount Pleasant Hotel. We also know that this shop was moved from alongside the General Store, where the Chemist shop had been situated since the early 1950s. But the business premises next to the General Store were not always as they are today, as can be seen in one of the pictures with this article.

Mr. Deryck Bentley, purchased the Treloar business premises in 1953 and was known as the jazz chemist... Mr. Bentley, who toured overseas with the Graeme Bell Australian Jazz Band, will open a new pharmacy at Mount Pleasant on July 1. He has bought out the business of Mrs. S. A. Treloar, who has been associated with the district for many years. Mrs. Treloar had The News and Mail agency and Mr. Bentley hopes to take this over. Dance bands in the district will be richer for Mr. Bentley's arrival. He played the trombone in Graeme Bell's famous band during the 18-month tour of England and Western Europe.

In 1960 the premises was purchased by Reginald Hallewell, and then to Arthur Holloway in 1961, before being purchased by Michael Woolard in 1964, who remained as the Mount Pleasant Pharmacist for more years than he probably cares to remember. The premises was then purchased by Wayne Goodwin, who continued the pharmacy before selling the business to the current Pharmacy owners.

And there was a Chemist shop elsewhere... in 1928 ... this newspaper article tells the story of a fire which destroyed the Chemist shop, situated opposite the new Soldiers' Memorial Hall:

News (Adelaide, SA: 1923 - 1954) **Monday 25 June 1928** p 1 Article:

**SHOP DESTROYED - FIRE AT MOUNT PLEASANT**  
Building Valued at £400  
MOUNT PLEASANT, Today.

A wood and iron shop valued at £400 was destroyed by fire at Mount Pleasant early this morning. It was occupied by Mr. R. Stevens, chemist, and owned by Mr. J. Reeks, who conducted a drapery business in a stone building next door. Shortly after midnight Mr. A. Reeks (son of the owner), who was sleeping at the



back of the stone shop, heard a crackling noise, and woke to find the shop full of smoke. He summoned his father and others, and between 40 and 50 townspeople were quickly on the scene. The window of the chemist's shop was broken and water was poured in by garden hoses and buckets, but it had no effect on the flames, which had obtained a secure hold. A motor car belonging to Mr. A. Reeks, which was in a shed next to the chemist shop, was saved. Several of the firefighters climbed on to the roof of the shop occupied by Mr. Reeks, and by attacking the flames there saved that building with the exception, of some roof rafters, which were burned. Little damage was done to the stock in the shop occupied by Mr. Reeks, who expressed his deep appreciation of the assistance rendered by the townspeople. The property was insured.
