



Anzac Biscuits

125 gms butter, chopped
2 tblsp golden syrup or treacle
1/2 tsp bicarb soda
2 tblsp boiling water
1 cup rolled oats
1 cup plain flour
1 cup firmly packed brown suga
3/4 cup desiccated coconut



Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F. Line two large oven trays with baking paper.

Stir butter and syrup in a medium saucepan over low heat until butter has melted and mixture is smooth. Stir in combined soda and water and then add the remaining ingredients.

Roll level tablespoons of mixture into balls, place them 5cm apart on lined trays and flatten slightly.

Bake for 12 mins or until golden brown. Cool biscuits on trays.

(Note: Use rolled oats rather than quick-cooking oats, as they will produce a different result)

You can store these in an airtight container for up to a week.
