

Recently the final three Brigades in the Barossa CFS Group completed their training in Advanced Resus and Casualty Care. This means Lyndoch, Concordia, Williamstown, Mount Pleasant, Springton and Eden Valley Brigades all carry Oxygen Therapy Kits to administer oxygen, perform CPR, maintain airways and apply torniquets.

Having this initial training was good, but we need to train on a regular basis to maintain a high skill level. The only problem was we needed additional training equipment, and our current budget didn't allow for the purchase of training QCPR Manikins and Torniquets.

So, we applied to the RAA Regional Safety Grants Program, and I was so surprised when I received a call from Emma to say that they would gladly pay the invoice to support the six Brigades in the Barossa CFS Group.



The Historical Society is seeking identification of this photograph. It is thought to have been taken during the first Gemutlichkeit on Monday 11th April 1977 held on the Lyndoch Oval.

Rebecca Rosenzweig in her book "A history of the Barossa Vintage Festival"" in reference to the Gemutlichkeit states With German food, German bands, performing German shepherd dogs, pony rides, hay rides, and rides for children including in a little cart which was pulled by German Rottweiller dogs were some of the entertainments on offer in 1977.



The next meeting of the Society will be held on Sunday 28th April at 2.00 p.m. in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library. The topic for the occasion will be "Lyndoch in 1914" and the declaration of World War I that occurred in August of that year.

#### **Declutter and Save**

The Barossa Council is again offering a kerbside

collection service or waste voucher to eligible residents, as part of its popular "Declutter and Save" initiative.

Both incentives require people to register directly with Solo Resource Recovery by phoning 8295 5077 or emailing adelaide.ops@solo.com.au, from now until 30 April to secure a collection date or claim a voucher.

Council's hard waste kerbside collection option enables people to dispose of up to two cubic metres of household hard waste material at their kerbside. This service will be available to the first 500 residents from Angaston, Eden Valley, Lyndoch, Moculta, Mount Pleasant, Nuriootpa, Penrice, Sandy Creek, Springton, Stockwell, Tanunda and Williamstown.

Accepted materials include furniture (excluding mattresses), white goods including fridges and freezers, electronics such as TVs and computers, carpets, gardening equipment, metal and timber. Meanwhile, rural and township residents who are unable to secure a kerbside collection are eligible for a hard waste/green waste voucher valued at \$75.

Five hundred vouchers will be available on a first-in-first-served basis, to be redeemed at Springton Transfer Station, Eco Waste Solutions, the Yard Clean Up Man and KAND do it. Vouchers are available for domestic waste only, with a range of waste materials accepted depending on the vendor. Vouchers must be used by 30 June, and to make it a little easier, the Springton Transfer Station will be open extra days, including 27 April, 25 May and 22 June. "Just note, only one service is available per financial year," Mayor Lange said. "So, if you chose to claim a voucher during the 'Declutter and Save' promo

tion held late last year, you are ineligible to participate this time. But stay tuned, there are plans for the initiative to return again next financial year." Terms and conditions apply so please visit barossa.sa.gov.au/declutter-and-save.
