#### The Referendum

Thank you to those who supported my last front page, and to those who were at least respectful. I don't see The Voice as being a political issue.

To me it's about social justice. Did you know that Lighthouses and our currency are mentioned in the Australian Constitution, but not our nation's First Peoples? Even though the King's instructions to Cook (via the Admiralty) were that he speak to the inhabitants, they were never legally acknowledged as the first inhabitants until Mabo, and the overturning of *Terra Nullius* in

1992. This journey has been an eye opener for me, heartening and depressing at the same time.

I am still hopeful that Australians will grant our First Nations peoples this simple request – that they have a say on matters that affect them, and that the voice will be added to the constitution. Remember – it's a voice TO the government – not IN the government, and the government can still legislate how the voice will operate. If you are still unsure about the details – google it. A few people have asked why I haven't added the case for the no



vote – and my answer is that there are so many conflicting responses, it would take up more than the simple question being asked. Yes – or No. I have tried to keep it simple.

Anyhow, my sister and I went to the Yes march the other weekend, it was Mandy's first protest and she was excited to be marching and supporting something that is important to her also. It was a fantastic day and extremely positive. I have added these small opinion pieces (2) because I pay for this newsletter entirely. I receive no funding from anyone in any way. I don't charge anyone for adding their

#### Pantry donations


Christmas is fast approaching, and there are local families

#### SA Spring Garden Festival



Hannah Moloney (pictured above with Ash Dent) was the guest speaker at this year's S.A. Spring Garden Festival, and what an amazing and passionate speaker she was. All the people I talked to hope that she will come back next year.

Here are some quick notes on how she got started in gardening and transitioned from an activist to advocate / activist.

#### Early life

Hannah credits her father as a major influence on how she views the world and said that he didn't need religion because "My church is the back paddock", which was their back yard.

Young Hannah and her family lived in Brisbane, and over the years their garden spread so that it flowed through several backyards.

She was also interested in social issues and the climate, and as soon as she could, took off to travel Australia, which took her three years. Her first stop was Adelaide and the Woomera detention centre. She says she went there to learn about doing no harm, but found the detention centre confronting. Although she said that is where she found 'her people'. She is a big advocate of self-education and obtained a university degree.

#### Activism and advocacy

Hannah is very passionate, and felt the need to be in the frontline of everything. Joining Tarkine campaign was very important to her, and she states that activism just means you care. Not everyone can be an activist, but you can find a way that suits you. If you are an activist, you need something to nourish you, because it can become very tiring, and she needed to find the way that suited her, so she chose to have a crack at Climate Change. Climate change touches everything, and she thinks it's better to try and do something instead of nothing. She became interested in Permaculture as promulgated by Bill Mollison and David Holmgren. Permaculture is a word originally coined by them in the mid 1970's to describe an "integrated, evolving system of perennial or self-perpetuating plant and animal species useful to man." Its holistic approach includes gardening and culture.

The Permaculture ethics include Earth Care. People Care. Fair Share.

#### Solution based activism

Now she is working on finding solutions, working with nature using people like Mollison, Holmgren and Penny Livingston-Stark as inspirations. Some of the things she has done can be found on her website - Home Composting Project - tackles food waste

Edible garden tours to address food security and climate resilience

Collaborating with artists to show what a climate safe future might look like.

Hannah says "When times of disruption come, we're not OK, and we can't be what we can't see."

As she moved a lot as a renter, she became good at growing food quickly. She used public spaces and managed city housing garden spaces. She helped establish the Hobart city farm, which has fed many families per week. She embraced looking after spaces and says that every plant is a good plant.

George's care is for his stock, He has no need of latch or lock, With dogs enough to guard his sleep, And tasks enough to more than keep His waking hours consumed.


I entered once, enquired of him If somewhere in those confines dim, A silky kitten he might find To cheer a little friend of mine In need of consolation.

Mum lived in the Hills for most of her life. She grew up at Houghton. She and Dad (Peter) lived in Mount Torrens for several years where they both joined the CFS. Mum was one of the first female crew for Mount Torrens and fought the Ash Wednesday fires in 1983. Later Mum and Dad moved to a property at Mount Pleasant where they bred Murray Grey cattle. After Dad's death in 1995, Mum moved to the river for a few years, but was drawn back to the Hills with its wonderful community, settling in Birdwood. She was involved in Probus club, becoming president for a while, as well as the Friends of Mount Pleasant Hospital. From 2009 to 2014 Mum was a member of the Hills Area Health Advisory Council, representing community members in health decisions for the region. She also loved her involvement in the Mount Pleasant Farmers' Market, especially in its early years during which she was a committee member and volunteer.

From Emily Ronan – Jo's daughter

Jo actually was one of the few people who responded when BankSA was closing and wrote an opinion piece for the newsletter. (Issue 3 - 2015) I remember her as being very engaged and we often had

great chats at the market. She was always very supportive and a fearless advocate for better health delivery.

Some of you may have heard Matt Hawkins – if you have been to the Lobethal Bierhaus, or the Palmer Pub and others. Sadly, he passed away recently. This was on the Lobethal Community Noticeboard page: Our hearts are heavy with the sad news of the sudden loss of our beloved local musician, and all-round man of kindness and generosity, Matt Hawkins. A shining star who gave his all to the local community, giving music and massive fundraising efforts after the bushfires. He will be deeply missed. Our hearts go with him as he journeys on, and our thoughts are with his dear Padma.

Some of you may also remember that Matt used to host the 'Thursday Night Locals' Show - on Lofty Community radio (7-8pm Music of the Hills (MOTH) 88.9), where he welcomed locals sharing stories, and musicians. Matt's funeral will be held at 2pm, Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October, at Kleeman's, Lobethal, followed by a wake at the Bierhaus.

#### Festival

A great day out at the Spring Festival with a huge crowd – and our loaded dogs!

#### Incidents

3<sup>rd</sup> September: At approximately 9.55am, <u>Mount Pleasant CFS</u> joined with Springton CFS to go for a Father's Day drive to meet with Mannum CFS, Walker Flat CFS and Ridley BWC and attend a structure fire on

Peters Road, Wongulla, in the State's Murraylands. The 6 CFS trucks crewed with 27 firefighters found a 10m x 6m shed well involved in fire on arrival. The shed contained 2 cars and a caravan, both of which were destroyed. Fortunately, due to the efforts of the firefighters, the fire was able to be contained to the shed and did not spread to the property's home nearby.

Damages are estimated at around \$150,000 and fire cause investigators have been requested, while CFS remained on scene until the area was made safe. 3 of our CABA operators were involved in knocking down the fire once power had been disconnected to the shed by SAPN.



12<sup>th</sup> September: A different way to start training as we had just started our pre training information briefing when one of our BOS members came in and said a tree had just fallen down across Railway Terrace. Sure enough, the tree right on the entrance to the station had dropped a lower limb which completely blocked the road. With 13 members, 2 appliances and 2 chain saws, the road was cleared in 15 -20 minutes and one of our members got some firewood for next year's supply. Photographs courtesy Barb Hoffman,
