in times Change

Rebekha Sharkie, member for Mayo - and still our elected representative until the next federal election - has written to the state Health Minister Stephen Wade on our behalf. These are the matters she put to him:

- 1. What efforts, if any, did SA Health make to secure additional medical practitioners to staff the overnight Accident and Emergency service before a determination was made to cease delivery of the service?
- 2. What arrangements are in place to ensure that those in the Mount Pleasant community who do require emergency services after hours will be provided with appropriate medical care?
- 3. Are you able to provide a briefing on the long term plans for the delivery of services at the Mount Pleasant District Hospital, noting this may provide an opportunity to assuage to concerns of the local community?

We await his answer.

Meanwhile - Wendy Harvey Director of Nursing for Gumeracha and Mt Pleasant Hospitals attended the community dinner on the 24th and had a few words to say about the current position:

From 4 March 2019, Mount Pleasant District Hospital will no longer provide overnight Accident and Emergency services between 6pm and 8am.

Mount Pleasant and district residents requiring emergency medical assistance at any time are asked to call an ambulance by dialling 000, and they will be taken to the most appropriate hospital.

From 4th March, the Mount Pleasant District Hospital Accident and Emergency service will continue to operate between the hours of 8am and 6pm - 7 days per week. Patients who self-present to the accident and emergency service after hours will be assessed by a Registered Nurse and treated or transferred as appropriate. If you need emergency medical help, always call an ambulance on 000

The reason for this change is that the Talunga clinic has experienced an unexpected and sudden reduction in the numbers of available Doctors.

To date all attempts to recruit additional Doctors have been unsuccessful and it is not possible for the remaining Doctors to continue to provide a 24 hour on call service for the Accident and Emergency Service.

Mt Pleasant Hospital Accident & Emergency — update cont'd from page 1

Last year there were 820 presentations to the Accident and Emergency Department at Mt Pleasant.

Almost all of these patients were in the non-urgent category. In 2018 there was an average of 4 presentations per week between the hours of 6pm and 8am.

Talunga Clinic is still operating and we aren't losing our doctors and they are available during business hours, and on some nights until 8 pm.

Angaston still has a 24hour Accident and Emergency service, as do Gawler, Mannum, Gumeracha and Mt Barker.

A question was asked regarding the merger of Gumeracha and Mt Pleasant Ambulance services.

Gumeracha doesn't have an ambulance service, but there is a site in Birdwood (where the old Nursery was) that has been cleared in preparation for a facility to be built there, and the Mt Pleasant station will close. That decision was made some time ago. Wendy is unsure how many ambulances will be based there.

For some months, before the change to the Accident and Emergency opening times was identified, Wendy has been working with SAAS (South Australian Ambulance Service) on a Destination Triage tool.

This is designed to guide decisions to get the patient to the right place for the right treatment as quickly as possible. For example, if a patient is having a stroke or heart attack, they would automatically bypass Mt Pleasant, no matter what time of day, to go to a metropolitan hospital which has the facilities they will need to carry out procedures such as dissolving clots or angiograms, which can't be done at Mt Pleasant.

When an ambulance is called, the operator is told what the patient is presenting with - and the method of transport is determined based on that individual patient.

During December the proposal was to close the Accident and Emergency facility for six months, and Wendy thought this was not a good option for the hospital, as it would have been difficult to re-establish it after that time. When it was decided to cut back the hours, it was a great outcome, because we still have an Accident and Emergency capability. There are 60 vacant positions across Country Health SA and many communities do not have doctors at all.

Another question asked was when does hospital become non-viable? From the 1st July 2019, the management arrangements across all SA Health will change to a local board. Our Board will be for all hospitals and health services in the current region (which will be known as a Local Health Network - LHN) including hospitals from Eudunda, Kapunda, Angaston, Tanunda, Gawler, Gumeracha, Mt Barker, Strathalbyn, Victor Harbor and Kangaroo Island as well as Mt Pleasant.

The LHN Board will assess each site for service provision and viability. It is possible that in future some hospital services may change. This will be based on community needs, for example Mt Barker is receiving an extensive upgrade to their facilities because of the massive increase in population. Our community supports the hospital, and it's important that it continues to do so. Without aged care services, the hospital is probably not viable. Our hospital has twelve hospital beds and twenty two aged care places. This combination allows the hospital to meet the needs of the community and have appropriate staff on duty at all times.

Do we have to be vigilant?

Both Mt Pleasant and Gumeracha hospitals (Wendy is the Executive Officer / Director of Nursing for both) are currently operating within the allocated budget and are still viable.

There is an opportunity to provide feedback via Genevieve Hebart who is a member of the Health Advisory Council which advocates for communities.

Wendy reminded people that subscribing to SA Ambulance Service was a good thing to do, especially if you want to avoid the approximately \$900 it will cost to go from a place of injury to hospital. If a patient presents by ambulance to the Mt Pleasant hospital, and needs to be transferred to another hospital, Mt Pleasant hospital bears the cost. But if you choose to go to a private hospital, it's at your cost and your Health Fund may not cover that cost.

Will volunteers be considered to become paid staff? Locals have local knowledge and might be able to get to the patient much more quickly.

Wendy replied that she is not sure if they will be upskilled, but they could be. There are Paramedics at Woodside, Angaston and Mannum. We don't currently have a 24hour ambulance service at Mt Pleasant.

There still seems to be some confusion in the community about going to Mt Pleasant Hospital Accident and Emergency Department.

It is still open from 8am to 6pm seven days a week. Currently Talunga Clinic runs on Saturday mornings for a few hours. In the future it may be all day, and they will think about a Sunday clinic. If you take ill and are unsure, and worried, ring the hospital. If you are very unwell it's better if you call an ambulance (in an emergency), or get someone to bring you in. Whilst nurses aren't able to admit you, after hours they can access phone advice from Gumeracha Hospital or MedStar. A nurse will have a few options to help you.

How can we get doctors to live here?

Living locally is not really the issue. Doctors are not prepared to work all day and then be on call overnight. If you are an admitted patient, your doctor will still be contactable, and doctors of residents in the nursing home are able to be contacted. In an emergency, staff will contact MedStar for phone support (which is also the case when a Doctor is on site) and MedStar will come to retrieve the patient if required.

The Mt Pleasant Hospital, as is the case in all hospitals across the world, cannot provide every service on site. We have centres of excellence less than an hour away by road, and 17 minutes by helicopter. The job of the local hospital is to assess and treat locally if safe to do so, and to transfer if required. That is the case 24 hours per day, and whilst we will not have a doctor on site between 6pm and 8am, the nursing staff will provide a comprehensive service to the community with remote support from a doctor.

In February 2019 Mt Pleasant Farmers Market celebrated their seventh birthday, commencing a year brimming with celebrations, major events and significant milestones for the popular southern Barossa market.

In April the market is preparing for their annual Easter Twilight Mega-Market showcasing a smorgasbord of the region's best producers. The ever-popular twilight market is an important drawcard to the region, with ample opportunity to purchase locally produced foods in a festival atmosphere.

Also held in April, the market is once again hosting their 4th annual Tasting Australia regional event. Marketing Manager Terese Stephens noted, "The event in previous years has been an early sell out event and 2019 is fast approaching that status with tickets highly sought after. The event gives an opportunity to meet the faces behind the food, and to enjoy a comprehensive 4-course tasting menu sourced entirely from the market's producers, surrounded by the Saturday morning market atmosphere. "

The celebrations continue with a major milestone for the community in May, the presentation of a ceremonial cheque to the value of \$100,000, in recognition of the ongoing fundraising initiatives for the community groups involved.

Terese explained "The money is raised through an optional onsite parking fee, a gold coin which is collected every Saturday at the Market gate. The Market links with a number of community groups – schools, charities, and other local interests – who spend their Saturday mornings collecting at the market gates to boost their fundraising efforts. Those funds

go back into our region to grow the good works of our community groups."

In September the market anticipates the return of the annual SA Spring Garden Festival, which is run in conjunction with the Farmers Market. The Spring Festival now in its fourth year and is a major event for both the market & the township of Mt Pleasant, attracting visitors from all over the State to enjoy the festival and all its offerings.

To round out the year the market will host its hugely popular 8th twilight Christmas Market, an unequalled favourite in the Barossa and Hills region.

"From small beginnings the market continues to grow," Terese says, "putting the township of Mount Pleasant on the map as a place to seek out and visit, and to enjoy the tastes of the Mount Pleasant Farmers Market. It also provides opportunity for the local community to shop local and support local. Many of our stallholders, family owned and run, have reported that their businesses have flourished in the last 7 years under the Farmer's Market banner. It is a winwin for community".

The Show Hall at the Annual Mt Pleasant Show is currently managed by Genevieve and Christopher Hebart.

The Show hall displays the Arts and Crafts, needlework, Cooking/baking. Vegetables, flowers etc.

Gen and Chris have been working with the Show Society in the Show Hall for over 20 years now, and have been specifically coordinating the hall activities since the retirement of Elaine and Neil Day

Gen and Chris will be retiring from this job in 2 years and would really appreciate it if there were another couple of community members who would like to take on the challenge. It will take a couple of shows to learn the system.

Skills required are good organisation, managing volunteers, some minor maintenance skills and the ability to delegate specific functions to volunteers who co-ordinate areas within the categories and also be able to work with the Show secretary and staff in the management of the day.

Gen and Chris also purchase (on behalf of the Show society) prizes for the various categories within the hall and there is a reasonable amount of paperwork and basic computer knowledge required.

Genevieve starts the organisation about 2 months prior to the Show, ensuring there are adequate volunteers, paperwork and shopping for prizes.

The week prior to the Show requires someone all day, every day, to work with volunteers in setting up the hall and working with the Show secretary in ensuring that all entries are managed.

The Friday and Friday night are very busy accepting entries and checking them off, but there are a number of volunteers who assist with this work.

The Saturday becomes hectic with more entries and managing the stewards and judges and then opening the hall for visitors.

Cleaning up is always done that afternoon, evening and the Hall left clean for the Farmers Market managers to move back on the Sunday.

Visitors will be shown how Steve and Chris have decorated the old police office, and also tour the courtyard and cells area where prisoners were incarcerated. Steve is also establishing extensive garden areas on the grounds.

Don and Sue Barrett will also show visitors through the old 'Elders' building, which was originally built as the Bank of South Australia before becoming a stock and station agents' premises for much of its life. Permission has just been given for the demolition of the 60's add-on, and they hope to restore it to its former glory over the next few months.

All this will take place during the hours of 1 to 4 on 27^{th} , 28^{th} and 29^{th} April. Bookings are desirable, and may be made (please see the posters for details).

During May we will be mounting an exhibit the Soldiers' Memorial Hall, with the theme of 'There was movement', documenting the movement of the early settlers and transport throughout the years.

CFS presenters Sarah Harris and Annie Pomeroy visited the men's Shed on the 12th to chat with us about being Bushfire Ready.

Have you written your Bushfire Survival plan? Few of the key things for people to note:

- Fire Danger Ratings: to check what the rating is each day of the bushfire danger season; once you know this, to act accordingly. This might mean changing your plans for the day and enacting your bushfire survival plan, etc.
- Understand the CFS warnings system and very importantly to know where to get information from. Do not rely completely on a mobile phone. Have a battery powered radio as well.

The CFS can also come to your home and go through how to make your place safer.

Clear vegetation from around your house – have nothing flammable within 2 metres, and manage vegetation within 20 metres.

Did you know there are 47 active fire safe groups in our area? The CFS attends around 2,000 bushfires per year.


There are three factors which directly affect fires – Fuel, Weather and Hills & Valleys. An important thing to note about the last is that for every 10° of slope, the fire speed doubles – a sobering statistic).

During the Victorian fires embers were starting fires kilometres in front of the actual firefront.

There is a lot of information on the website, ie where to get information about a fire etc.






