The Soccer Club is also having a fundraiser – An Evening with Amity Dry – on 16^{th} July, now that sounds like something worth seeing.


And just in case the usual comfort food isn't working – celebrate World Chocolate Day at Melba's on the 7th!

Caravan Park upgrade

There was no meeting of the Progress Association this month, but here is a prepared statement regarding the upgrading of the Caravan Park:

"It is good to hear that with a funding grant and back up finances from Council, the Mt Pleasant Caravan Park is to be upgraded at last.

The works will start in September this year and are planned to be finished at the end of the 2022 financial year.

This upgrade will also include significant changes to the electrical supply and switchboard.

The upgrade will include the following:

- An increased number of sites with water, power & sullage
- Drive through sites
- Camp kitchen ٠
- **BBO** shelter •
- Recreation zones •
- Roadway upgrade •
- 2 Cabins

As with any major works, there will be some significant disruption to the users of the Park

Unfortunately, and unavoidably, the long-term residents of the Park are required to move out for the duration of the

upgrade. As we understand it, the Council is doing their best to re-home these residents in nearby Parks, such as Murray Park at Eden Valley, for the interim, but they will be able to return as soon as the major works are completed.

Should you have any queries about this upgrade or wish to view the plans, please do not hesitate to contact your local Councillor Don Barrett, or members of the Mt Pleasant Progress Association, Wendy Harvey and Genevieve Hebart. Plans will be available for viewing at the Mt Pleasant Farmers Market."


Town Brochure

Could it be SAD?

What is seasonal affective disorder (SAD)?

Seasonal affective disorder (SAD) is a type of <u>depression</u> that comes and goes according to the season. People with SAD have symptoms of depression or mania at roughly the same time each year.

SAD usually develops in autumn and winter, then disappears in spring and summer. In some people, the symptoms develop in spring and early summer.

What are the symptoms of SAD?

Symptoms usually start out mild and get worse as the season progresses. When the season changes, people normally become completely well again.

Symptoms of SAD in winter include:

- lack of energy
- sleeping too much
- finding it hard to wake up in the morning
- feeling very tired all the time
- overeating and craving carbohydrates

- gaining weight
- <u>losing interest</u> in normal activities
- Symptoms of SAD in summer include:
- <u>trouble sleeping</u>
- <u>not feeling hungry</u>
- losing weight
- feeling <u>agitated</u> and <u>anxious</u>


People with a mental health disorder might find their symptoms change at different times of the year. For example, some people with <u>bipolar disorder</u> find they are more likely to experience mania in spring and summer and depression in winter.

What causes SAD?

SAD is thought to be caused by changes to the body's circadian rhythms (its 'body clock') at certain times of the year. It may also happen because in winter the body produces less of the hormones melatonin and serotonin, which affect sleep and mood.

When should I see my doctor?

SAD is rare in Australia, but many Australians report that they feel flat and lethargic in winter. If you have symptoms that don't go away and are affecting your everyday life, it's important to see a doctor.




Council employees were out this week cleaning up the last of the old pine trees, ready for topsoil in the picnic area at the front of Talunga park.

State of Play

Some of you have heard various versions of us having to close...or perhaps you are wondering why you haven't had a response to emails or messages recently...

The reality is we have been fighting for nearly 2 years now to secure ongoing funding to keep the Mount Pleasant Natural Resource Centre Inc and all of its community projects operating- including Recreate.

Our staff and volunteers are tired. We have had to expend so much energy on trying to convince state and local government that they should continue to support community environment centres such as ours. At the same time dealing with the impact and stress of bushfires, COVID, a rapidly increasing workload, continued funding cuts, and still trying to deliver on our community development and environmental projects. The human cost of this fight has largely been unseen as we have tried to put on a positive face for our community projects but it has been a stressful and exhausting time.

So, what is happening? Short term we are operating as normal till end of June. Then we are going to close the doors for two weeks to give our Coordinator Faye a much-needed mini break.

Then we regroup and put in place a revised community project and employment plan for another 6 to 8 months. Things are going to look and run differently to give us the best chance of survival, and there will be times when we call on our awesome community to step up and help us.

We haven't given up. We just need a chance to pause and breathe.

What can you do now? Continue to support us with crucial fundraising sales via recreate. Talk to your local MP or councillor about what keeping community environment centres open means to you. Be kind if we don't respond to enquiries quickly - we are doing our best.

As we work out our next steps, we will let you know in what direction we are headed.
