

Intersection upgrade

Not in our district, but still well used by us — an interesting approach to road safety:

Works to improve safety at the T-junction of Williamstown Road and Balmoral Road, Cockatoo Valley, are scheduled to commence tomorrow, Monday, October 25, and are due for completion by mid-December, weather permitting.

The works will be undertaken between 7am and 5pm, Monday to Friday.

A Rural Junction Active Warning System will be installed at the junction. These systems use variable speed-limit signs to slow traffic at rural intersections when traffic is present on the side road; this system is already in use at the Angaston/Stockwell Road intersection adjacent Barossa Farmers Market/Vintners Barossa.

The road will remain open with speed and lane restrictions in place, including a 25km/hr speed restriction while workers are on site. Please plan ahead, allow extra time and take care while travelling through the area.

Bird of the Year


A beloved small bird known for its polyamory and shared household labour narrowly beat the tawny frogmouth and gang-gang cockatoo in the Guardian Australia/Birdlife Australia poll.



The superb fairywren has been voted bird of the year for 2021, narrowly defeating the tawny frogmouth in a nail-biting finish.

The winner of the Guardian Australia/Birdlife Australia poll was announced on Friday after more than 400,000 votes were cast during the 10-day competition.

The beloved small bird, which is showing signs of decline in its traditional habitat in urban areas, won with 13,998 votes, just ahead of the popular tawny frogmouth on 13,332.



The gang-gang cockatoo, which had strong backing from Canberra residents and those concerned about

its likely endangered status, placed third with 12,836 votes.

The suj

The superb fairywren emerged as a clear favourite over the two weeks of the poll, regularly topping the daily count.

The male birds are recognisable by their blue feathers and the species has become famous for its polyamory and passion for sharing

household labour.

Males leave the territory during the day and perform courtship displays to other females, but it is the females that ultimately control mate choice as well as the nest.

Holly Parsons is BirdLife Australia's urban birds program manager and a superb fairywren supporter.

"It's really exciting to see a bird that so many people love and appreciate take out the top prize," she said.

"What's great is that this is a bird that people can help at home. You can plant shrubs for them and create great habitat in your space to help these birds."

Power outage info

Guaranteed Service level Payment

The Essential Services Commission of South Australia (ESCoSA) has reviewed the Guaranteed Service Level (GSL) Scheme. It decided to simplify the scheme to reduce costs to customers and to ensure it better targeted customers who have the poorest underlying reliability experience.

GSL duration payments for extended power interruptions will apply when a customer experiences more than 20 hours of interruptions over a financial year. A flat payment will be made for a customer who experiences more than nine outages a financial year.

To be eligible you need to be residing at the impacted premises on 30 June. The GSL amount will be automatically credited to your retailer and reflected in a subsequent electricity account.


Remembering our soldiers

The Mount Pleasant Community has several memorials in place to commemorate those men who left the district to 'fight for their country', and these also include the several women who went off as nurses.

The first of these was a Roll of Honor which was placed at the Presbyterian Church in July 1918, now the Uniting Church. This contained 82 names.

The second memorial was placed within the Church of England church, and unveiled in September 1918. This contained 40 names, some the same as those above, but there are differences.

And finally there is the Soldiers' Memorial Hall, but not until much later.



On the day of the official opening in 1927 ...



The threatening and chilly weather did not deter a large number of people from attending the opening ceremony of the Mount Pleasant Soldiers' War Memorial on July 16. The chairman of the hall committee (Mr. F. Dewell) said the building still had a debt. The secretary (Mr. V. C. Cooke) gave a brief description of the committee's work. The first meeting, he said, was held in 1914, and since then 123 meetings had been held. Various committees had been appointed, and all had worked together. Mr. W. Ross Smith (treasurer) said the interest taken in the erection of the memorial was very satisfactory. When he took over the books in November, 1925, the fund had £2,884 to its credit. They had received donations amounting to £1,740, and fetes had raised £427. These sums, together with several others, made a total of £5,166 19/6. The expenditure on the building had been £6,081 8/3, so that there was a debt of £914 8/9 still on the building. It supplied a long-felt want in that district, and would undoubtedly succeed in perpetuating their memory. The president of the institute committee (Mr. R. S. Davey) said the entrance hall of the memorial had been declared the Hall of Dedication. Mr. Dewel was

presented with a silver key as a memento of the occasion. He said he was highly honored [sic], and opened the hall.Afternoon tea was provided in the supper-room after the opening ceremony, and a fete was held. The stallholders were: — Jumble. Mesdames A. H. Shanks, P. Smith, F. Staples, and Miss J. Talbot: sweets, Mesdames M. Jones, M. Wellsman, McCann, and Miss M. Maitland; cake, Mesdames R. S. Prior and L. McBean. Mrs. Hicks was convener of the afternoon tea. A concert was given in the evening by the Adelaide Lyric Company, followed by a dance. The institute committee is composed of Messrs. R. S. Davey (president), V. C. Cooke (secretary, Dr. V. Jones, Messrs. W. Ross Smith, P. T. Gehling, and H. Verral.

This is just a portion of the description of the day, but it can be noted that the Boards which now hang in the Hall of Dedication did not eventuate until 1929, and there is also a board with those who served during World War 2 also in place now, along with that from Cromer, which was placed here for safe-keeping after damage had been done to the school-room where it once hung.

In 2010 another memorial was placed at the corner of Memorial Avenue, to those who died during World War 1. This avenue was planted with pines originally and a replacement of trees was planted in the 1930s before the current Claret Ash trees we see today.

Media Release 16 Oct

A new program under trial by the SA Country Fire Service this fire danger season will provide better coverage for participating farm firefighting unit (FFU) operators. Specifically, the program will look to provide FFU operators that register with the CFS at firegrounds better access to safety and insurance arrangements. The value of South Australia's farm units was highlighted through various postseason reports from the 2019-2020 Black Summer season. CFS Executive Director Frontline Services Support Georgie Cornish said, building on the recommendations of the Keelty Review, the CFS was introducing a trial program to support and coordinate FFU operators. "We are encouraging owners of FFUs to register with the CFS, so that we can work together when they respond with our volunteers to bushfires," Ms

Cornish said. "By better coordinating our approach with FFU operators on the fireground, we will be able to provide improved support for everyone helping on the fireground." Operators are invited to register their units and find more details about the program at: https://cfs.sa.gov.au/prepare-for-a-fire/farm-fire-units/

Emergency Services Minister Vincent Tarzia also acknowledged the crucial role FFU's play during bushfires. "The FFU community is undoubtedly dedicated to protecting lives and property," Minister Tarzia said. "FFU efforts especially at the Cudlee Creek, Yorketown and Kangaroo Island fires - highlights their importance as we all work together to create a more bushfire resilient South Australia. "That's why the Marshall Liberal Government quickly initiated the Keelty Review into the tragic 2019-2020 fire season and has delivered a \$97.5 million action plan to boost South Australia's defence against bushfires."

See the Lofty Ranges roll away, To the Gulf and the Westering sun, THEN it's a wonderful life out fencing, And pride in a job well done.


