There is no bully at our gate, Our homeland to enslave, No bloody conflict to endure, In the land of the Free and Brave.


Stand tall and free, rejoicing At the rising of the sun, And honour The ANZAC legend, Their race is o'er – And won.



Anzac Day Dawn Service MP RSL President's report



The hall was a bit less packed without Michael Williams' trench and mannequins, however Graham Westwood stepped up to the task and put on a grand display of uniforms and WW1 swords and other collectables, as well as his excellent paintings. The Mount Pleasant and Springton schools put on a great display as well, keeping many people occupied with reading all the information they had gathered.

Paula Bartsch from The Mount Pleasant District History Research Group also mounted a display of information about those who served from the district. (This and much more is available in her book "Remembering Our Soldiers" – available for purchase from the History Room Thursday afternoons.)

Although many businesses are suffering due to COVID-19 they still managed to come up with some great prizes, and we managed to arrange 15 raffles and one auction worth over \$900. The service started at 0615 after Mark Wilksch realised the CD I had given him was in MP3 format and his audio equipment couldn't play it. He quickly raced home and solved the problem with his laptop, saving the day for me.

Steve Dear was fully dressed in his Light Horse uniform and was mounted on his horse Chilli, and Mark Holt was also in the background with his troop carrier. Chilli is a seasoned performer at over 30 years, and she played her part beautifully. Both these two attractions were very popular after the ceremony with both adults and children. Rob from Robbers Dog was the next most popular person as he was selling drinks for the Mount Pleasant Hotel.

Once the breakfast was finished people headed out the back to get the 2-Up started and when finished with that, then got stuck into Crown and Anchor. In between we had our 15 raffles then I tried as hard as I could to remove as much money from people as I could for the Auction. The 2-UP and Crown and Anchor was a very steep learning curve for our new Ring Keeper, Gus, however the Springtonites kept him in line, showing him the error of his ways.

Finally, the best news was that the RSL has been successful in securing a \$30,000 grant from DVA, to completely revamp our kitchen and rewire the entire hall with new lights. There are many other things we will be replacing or renovating. This

massive task was undertaken by our member Roger Benton who spent a huge amount of time collecting quotes for a multitude of jobs, equipment and appliances. After all quotes were obtained he then spent many hours writing up the grant, receiving help from Tony Pasin. So, thank you Roger, and I'm sure your hard work will be enjoyed by many. I'm sure his lovely wife Collette, had some help in all this work as well.

There were many other people who helped out on the day, Pastor Daniel Marks with his spiritual input to our service, Lance Corporal Brad Howship, the CFS Cadets with their flag raising, RSL members too many to mention, Peter Wilde for his Poem, Peter Stevens, Glynn Jackson, Robbers Dog Distillery for their rum and Rob for running the bar on behalf of the Mount Pleasant Hotel / Motel, Gus for running the 2-Up and Crown and Anchor, Paula Bartsch for her help in organising the hall and her great historical displays, and finally SACWA, Red Cross and the locals who made all the poppies hung from the SMH and wrapped around the trees, and also the great ANZAC biscuits. A truly great day with much help from the local community.

And last, but not least – thank you to all our wonderful community members, who have turned out in droves the last few years to help us remember the fallen and commemorate the roles all our armed forces and support groups have played in the many conflicts in which Australia has been involved.







both directions between Randell road and R Hicks road. SAAS and SAPOL were also in attendance. SAPN worked to make the scene safe.





- 4. Business arising / ongoing:

 - The Caravan Park office space has no air-conditioning or lining. A letter to be written to Council to ask for this to occur.
 - There was discussion about the possibility of having free WIFI at Talunga Park. Wendy to follow through with this
 - Oval seating has been installed with a few more to be done.
 - Graeme is suggesting that the town banners should celebrate the steam trains. He will do some sketches and bring to the next meeting.
 - Naming of the restored wooden animals competition to be developed this month.
 - A new plaque has been purchased and will be funded by the Rex Amber Memorial Trust fund. The trustees have agreed to the request for \$2500 for the renovation of the playground.
 - The gate on the playground has been installed. A letter of thanks to the donors for their contribution for the community. (pictured right)
 - There were more positive comments about the murals on the SA water tank
 - Graeme will begin to paint more murals on the old sheds. It was resolved to reimburse him for paint used on the Shearing mural.
 - Gareth has taken the lead on the risk assessment for the train but needs clarification on some issues. He will contact John Bowd re these issues.
 - Peter Wilde is continuing to follow through with the out of date signage and the Hughes oval sign.
 - The issue of the rent for the community dinner is related to license policy reviews from council.
- 5. Councillor Report.
 - Don reported on the plans for further Melrose Street road and footpath renewal
 - Don attended the Open Gardens at Springton and suggested that Mt Pleasant might look at doing something similar as it was quite successful.
- 6. Sub Committee reports:
 - Talunga Park: It was noted that the drainage works have commenced and that this is potentially going to be disruptive to the Twilight Market.

- The Community Dinner was successful.

 Genevieve to work with the liquor licensing commission about licenses for the Progress Association.
- **SALA**. Jo Dennis will be holding a SALA event during August with 2 other artists.
- Fit and Fifties: nil further
- Fleece and Fibre fair: Genevieve reported that she would begin planning for this event after Easter and asked that members help when required. There was general discussion about the venue and it was recommended that the event move to the Market Show Hall on the Sunday (third weekend in August)
- FOCS&CC: Pauline had emailed a report to members.

7. New Business

- Genevieve reported a conversation with Roger Benton about replacing the seating in front of the hall with very elaborated laser cut metal seats which are specific to the RSL. There was general in principal support for the idea, but concern about the cost of the seating at \$2500 each. The Seating outside the Hall belongs to the Council and if this idea gained enough support, it might be possible to place the seats at Talunga park. There will be no further action until there is an indication that Roger has been able to raise the necessary funds.
- ToTT has a new and vibrant committee which is planning a play for June or July. The committee expressed their support for this new group.
- Wendy reported that the current pamphlets are in short supply and the group will need to begin work on the next iteration of the document.
- It was recommended that the current key register for the hall be reviewed and that this should be checked annually.

Would love to have him on board but remuneration not strong! Less is more. Golf started in Mount Pleasant in the beginning of the 20th century at his family home at Rosebank. Below is an extract from 'The Mail' in 1928.

Rosebank holds the distinction of possessing one of the oldest golf links in Australia. It was established many years ago by the Melrose family, and today it is the recognised links of the Mount Pleasant Golf Club, to which body Mr. R. T. Melrose has donated the course.

So, Augusta is renowned for its Amen Corner which players pray not to get undone through holes 11, 12, 13. Well at Mount Pleasant we reckon we have 2 Amen Corners where things can go terribly wrong and wreck any potential to do well in a competition.

Amen Corner I (for Men)

Our First Amen corner starts at the 2nd. A Par 3 which in theory poses no real threats. Club selection is priority and wind direction are a concern. Out of bounds on the right has collected many lofted shots blown into the paddock. Over correct and lost ball into the dam is a possibility. But a Par is a must Next the 3rd hole. Our signature holes. A drive over the water and clearing 200m will allow a pitch onto to the larger green in regulation and 2 putts. Another par here please. But no fade or hook as this would lead to disaster.. Watch for over corrections in swing.

Onto to 4th....A short par 4 and you are thinking birdie.(and it could be!)

Put the driver away and find the club which will allow a 180m left to right shaped shot to land in the middle of the fairway. 2 classic overhanging 200year-old gums protect the green and a water hazard on the back right there to punish. Decision time!



But the green is small, and the ball has a tendency to run through to the back.

Get through these 3 holes on a prayer and on Par will be the go and set up the round.


