A Pathway to Prosperity initiative made possible by the dedication of the Friends of Mount Torrens and the generosity of our supporters News Corp, Woodside Landscapes, Ideal Mix Concrete, Edwards family farms, Epress, Adelaide Hills Veggie Gardens, Bee Happy art studio, Coopers of Mount Torrens and JD Smith Constructions.

Following are my thoughts as an Adelaide Hills Councillor, and may not be those of Council.

Adelaide Hills Council Annual Business Plan and budget has been approved by Council. In summary, due to the high CPI at March and cost pressures due to increasing costs, a rate increase of 4.9% was agreed, resulting in income of \$53.3m, expenditure \$51.9m, with an operating surplus of \$1.4m, going towards Capital works of \$22.3m, including \$11.8m for new and upgraded assets, with additional borrowings of \$7.3m - *visit ahc.sa.gov.au to view Annual Business Plan and Budget*. Local projects include contribution to Amy Gillett \$100k(State Government project), Mt Torrens Heritage toilets (at time cost still being determined), Gumeracha Library upgrade \$115k, etc. Council elections are this year, want to make a difference in your community consider standing - see *ahc.as.gov.au or LGA website for information, or speak with a current Councillor.* If you have any questions about the budget, or anything Council related, please contact myself, Linda Green, 0418 858 429 or one of my fellow Councillors, details are listed on *ahc.sa.gov.au* Kind Regards, Linda Green

"In 1922, a new larger primary school was built further along Prescott Street between the town and the cemetery".

Look in boxes in the shed, cellar, ceiling etc. Ask your parents, ex-staff, friends or anyone who helped when the school closed in 2014 if they have any information; it would be a great asset to the History Centre & the Community.

Mt Torrens Community Garden

Located off Dunfield Drive, Mount Torrens

We are growing! We now have five wicking beds. The latest designed and donated by Mark Smith from Adelaide Hills Veggie Gardens allowing easy access by people who use walkers or wheelchairs. We are hoping to involve some of our older residents and those from nearby nursing homes in the garden.

Everybody is encouraged to harvest from the Community Garden.

The garden is for everyone. And it is pleasing to see that much of the produce has been disappearing. The kale seems to have been the favourite, closely followed by the lettuce and spinach. If you haven't had any yet don't worry there is still plenty of other things to pick, as everyone is doing the right thing and harvesting the outside leaves leaving 5-6 leaves in the centre so that they can continue to grow and produce more leaves for future harvest. Following feedback we will do more group planting and labelling in the future so that it is easier for people to identify the veggies.

How do I get involved in growing, I hear you ask?

Simply come to one of the working bees. They are every 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month, 10am to 12noon. We look after the veggie beds, share information, seeds/ plants etc. make plans for future expansion, and contribute to the maintenance of the native gardens around the retention ponds. What and how much you do is up to each individual.

Getting ready for spring planting

Yes, it is time! Time to start planning what to grow. We would love to hear from the community what they would like us to grow. Do you want tomatoes, capsicum, cucumbers, lettuce??? The group will start to raise seedlings soon, so if you have spare seeds or favourite seeds that you would like us to grow, then drop them off at one of the working bees soon.

Mt Torrens CFS

The cold wet weather is making a return again this week. It's a timely reminder for care when using clothes dryers. There have been 4 house fires in Adelaide due to dryers this week. There are simple measures we can take to prevent the spontaneous combustion happening, resulting in fires.

1. Always check washing when completed, don't leave in dryer. If still damp then put dryer on again. Or hang on clothes racks to complete drying.

 Avoid putting on dryer then going out for the day.
It is essential to have working fire alarms in your house, when did you last replace batteries? How old are your fire alarms? The recommendation is to replace every 10 years, or sooner if they are faulty.

Now is the time to start planning for your Summer clean up for fire safety around your property.

Reduce weeds in your garden, around your house and sheds.
Prune back trees and shrubs.

3. Check driveways for clearance of branches overhanging. Our CFS truck needs at least a 3 metre clearance.

4. Rake up and remove loose small branches and twigs from under trees and shrubs.

5. Keep your gutters clean.

6. Re check your fire kits. Radio and torches, are the batteries working? Do you have all important documents?

Do you have kits made up for your pets if you have to grab and evacuate quickly

7. Do you have a fire plan? Is everyone in your household aware of your plan? Have you practiced your plan?

8 Time to check and repair any fire fighting equipment. When was your fire pump last serviced or started?
