

'What A Mix'

The conditions may have been un-seasonally cool, damp & grey however there were visitors-a-plenty and smiles all 'round at the TOTT on Sunday 23rd October for the official opening of 'What a Mix', a mixed media exhibition by Joe Dennis.

In opening the exhibition, Joes' longtime friend and Member of the Pastel Association of South Australia Lesley Jorgensen raised the questions of

"What makes an artist & Why do they create?"

"If you make Art, you are an Artist" she said, "It is not dictated by financial or professional success.

You don't have to have been to Art School to be an Artist. A true Artist constantly educates themselves. They walk a path of self-development and try to keep up with the changing times. True artists are learners for life, they believe in growth and are always trying to improve."

Lesley offered many reasons as to why artists create including "for fun & personal satisfaction – the joy they get from mixing paint or the tactile qualities of having clay on their hands.

The pleasure achieved from making something beautiful or useful.

Some people use it as a means of expressing emotions, beliefs, feelings and memories.

Others use it to try and influence people, to have either a positive or negative affect on the viewer.

For many artists it is a way of celebrating the aesthetics of the ordinary or common and mundane things and for others such as Joe, it is a way of depicting the beauty that they see in nature and the landscape".

The exhibition is on display until 4th December.

What's on now at AGSA?

What's AGSA you say? It's our very own Art Gallery of South Australia, situated on North Terrace Adelaide, and what a centre of energy and creativity it is!

I'm now lucky enough to be a volunteer Gallery Guide at AGSA which enables me to indulge my love of art and art galleries and share this with visitors of all ages.

Currently the Gallery is resetting after the very successful exhibition Archie 100: A century of the Archibald Prize which ran from 9 Jul to 3 Oct 2022. The next exhibitions are either already up or nearly so. Here's what's on at the Gallery from now until the end of the year.

WAVE, 19 Oct 2022 - 8 Jan 2023 — "This genre-defying work of art unites digital imagery, ceramics and sound in an immersive 360-degree installation in the Elder Wing of the Art Gallery of South Australia... Visitors are invited on an epic journey from sea to sky through this new form of storytelling that unites the mythic imagery of Gerry Wedd and the sonic intensity of Gabriella Smart. https://www.agsa.sa.gov.au/whats-on/exhibitions/wave/

Richard Bell – Embassy, 21-23 Oct 2022 This installation is inspired by the Aboriginal Tent Embassy, the protest camp set up 50 years ago on the lawns of Parliament House in Canberra. It's situated on the AGSA forecourt on North Terrace as part of Tarnanthi, AGSA's acclaimed celebration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art, and features a three-day program of talks and film screenings. https://www.agsa.sa.gov.au/whats-on/exhibitions/richard-bell-embassy/

Nalini Malani: Gamepieces, 5 Nov 2022 - 22 Jan 2023 This is an immersive sensory installation which draws on AGSA's substantial holdings of Malani's work from her early experimentation with film and photography to what she describes as 'video shadow/plays' such as *Gamepieces*, 2003–09/2020.

Bewilderness: Recent acquisitions, 26 Nov 2022 - 16 Apr 2023 Showcasing recent acquisitions in painting, printmaking and sculpture, this exhibition considers landscape as a form of representation deeply embedded in questions of identity and belonging.

Pure Form: Japanese sculptural ceramics, 21 May - 6 Nov 2022 — this one is ending very soon so if you haven't seen it, it's well worth a visit. Abstract sculptural ceramics emerged in Japan in the aftermath of WWII. It was a daring movement, totally opposite to the functional and minimalistic ceramics of the past. The forms are breathtaking in their beauty and creativity. A must-see.

Neo Teen Takeover, Sat 22 Oct, 6.30-8pm - Neo is a free after-hours event for young people aged 13-17 years. This month is a special *Neo Teen Takeover* celebrating the power of young people through costume, aerosol art, live music, and one-of-a kind dance experiences. Yayoi Kusama: The Spirits of the Pumpkins Descended into the Heavens, Until 2 April 2023. This is one the children love! "Yayoi Kusama is best known for her immersive polka-dot and mirror installations. Over the course of her 70-year career, she has engaged with an expansive idea of space and the human body. She uses several recurring motifs — dots, eyes, nets and pumpkins — to investigate repetition and to create sensory experiences that hint at the infinite.
