Mid Murray Council Elections

Are you enrolled to vote in the November 2022 Council Election?

Participating in your local Council election is one of the most effective ways you can make a difference to everyday life in your community and the district as a whole, and Council encourage you to enrol and make your vote count in 2022.

Enrol to Vote - The voters roll closes 5pm Friday, 29 July 2022

State Electoral Roll: If you are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll for the Mid Murray Council area, you do not need to re-enrol, you will automatically receive ballot papers through the post. To check your enrolment details, visit the Australian Electoral Commission website: <https://check.aec.gov.au>

Council Supplementary Voters Roll: If you are not enrolled on the State Electoral Roll you may be eligible to register on the council supplementary roll if you are:

- a resident or a non-Australian citizen who has lived at your residential address for one month or more
- an owner of an organisation or business
- an owner of a holiday home
- a sole owner or group of owners of a rateable property
- a sole occupier or group of occupiers of a rateable property
- a landlord of a rateable property

Council must purge the supplementary roll on 1 January of each periodical election year, therefore if you were registered on the Council Supplementary Voters Roll for previous elections, you will be required to re-enrol to be eligible to vote in November.

Enrolment forms for Council's Supplementary Voters Roll are available from either downloading them from Local Government SA website www.lga.sa.gov.au/council-elections/enrol or Council's website by clicking on the links below. The form can be returned to Council via post to PO Box 28, Mannum SA 5238 or by dropping the completed form into a Council Office.

To nominate for a position on Mid Murray Council, you must be enrolled to vote in the Council area.

Enrolment Forms:

Form 1 - Natural person - Where single owner or occupier is a natural person

Form 2 - Body Corporate - Where a designated person is required to vote on behalf of the body corporate

Form 3 - Group Owners - Where property is owned or occupied by more than one person and/or business/organisation. A designated person is required to vote on behalf of the Group

RES Australia is proposing to develop, construct and operate a battery project adjacent to the existing Tungkillo Substation, approximately 8.5km east of Mount Torrens. If constructed, the project will provide up to 270 MW of on demand energy.

The project proposes approximately 216 modular battery storage units, on approximately 14 hectares of land that is currently utilised for grazing alongside Black Heath Road.

RES Australia is currently reaching out to the local community to introduce the project and seek to understand any potential impacts and opportunities that may flow from a grid-scale battery project in the region.

Research shows that certain language may be problematic when discussing suicide or mental illness.

Consider the language you use

Issue	Problematic	Preferred
Presenting suicide as a desired outcome	✗ 'successful suicide' 'unsuccessful suicide'	✓ 'died by suicide' 'took their own life'
Associating suicide with crime or sin	✗ 'committed suicide' 'commit suicide'	✓ 'took their own life' 'died by suicide'
Sensationalising suicide	✗ 'suicide epidemic'	✓ 'increasing rates' 'higher rates'
Language glamourising a suicide attempt	✗ 'failed suicide' 'suicide bid'	✓ 'suicide attempt' 'non-fatal attempt'
Gratuitous use of the term 'suicide'	✗ 'political suicide' 'suicide mission'	✓ refrain from using the term suicide out of context

Consider the language you use

Issue	Problematic	Preferred
Certain language sensationalises mental illness and reinforces stigma	✗ Terms such as 'mental patient', 'nutter', 'lunatic', 'psycho', 'schizo', 'deranged', 'mad'	✓ A person is 'living with' or 'has a diagnosis of' a mental illness
Terminology that suggests a lack of quality of life for people with mental illness	✗ Referring to someone with a mental illness as a 'victim', 'suffering from' or 'afflicted with' a mental illness	✓ A person is 'being treated for' or 'someone with' a mental illness
Labelling a person by their mental illness	✗ A person is 'a schizophrenic', 'an anorexic'	✓ A person 'has a diagnosis of', or 'is being treated for schizophrenia'
Descriptions of behaviour that imply existence of mental illness or are inaccurate	✗ Using words such as 'crazed', 'deranged', 'mad', 'psychotic'	✓ The person's behaviour was unusual or erratic
Colloquialisms about treatment can undermine people's willingness to seek help	✗ Using words such as 'happy pills', 'shrinks', 'mental institution'	✓ Accurate terminology for treatments e.g. antidepressants, psychiatrists or psychologists
Terminology used out of context adds to misunderstanding and trivialises mental illness	✗ Terms like 'psychotic dog', using 'schizophrenic' to denote duality such as a 'schizophrenic economy'	✓ Reword any sentence that uses psychiatric or medical terminology incorrectly or out of context

What will be accepted: clean residential green waste, including:

- Grass clippings
- Prunings
- Leaves
- Small branches, up 100mm in diameter

What will not be accepted:

- Commercial loads of materials
- Waste or hard rubbish
- Soil
- Proclaimed weeds, these include: rose, poplar, blackberry, gorse, olive, bridal creeper, kikuyu, couch & bamboo

Dogs and Cats Online

From 1 July 2018, Dogs and Cats Online (DACO) will be the central database for microchipped and registered dogs and cats and registration payments throughout South Australia. Follow this link to access

DACO www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au.

Dogs and Cats Online will also be the register of breeders.

Dogs and Cats Online has been developed to allow pet owners to instantly update registration or microchip details if you move house or change phone numbers, and pay your annual registration fees.

Dogs and Cats Online will also assist councils, shelters and the general public in reuniting lost pets with their owners.

Existing dog owners will receive a renewal notice in the mail during July 2018 with their dog's new lifetime registration disc (replacing the annual disc) and instructions on how to complete their annual dog registration on Dog and Cats Online. You are not likely to receive this in the mail until mid to late July. If you do not receive a renewal notice for your dog, please contact council on 8569 0100.

Registration of Dogs

All dogs must be registered at three months of age. Go to www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au to register your dog.

Rebates are provided by Council for desexed, microchipped and obedience trained dogs. Proof and/or certificates are required to be provided in order to receive these rebates.

Concession card holders are also eligible for discounted dog registration - see Councils registration fees below.

Late payment fees apply to registrations paid after the due date. Failing to register your dog may also result in a fine being issued. To avoid additional costs please renew your dogs registration by **August 31 each year**.

Transfer of registrations must be requested within 14 days of moving house. This can be done through Dogs and Cats Online.

Please update on Dogs and Cats Online or notify Council within 72 hours if your dog dies, you move house or your dog is transferred to another person's ownership.

Backyard Burning (Outside the Fire Danger Season)

Burning in the open is regulated by the Environment Protection Authority, within the Environment Protection (Burning) Policy 1994 in accordance with the Environment Protection Act 1993.

Residents are permitted to burn dried gardening prunings, dry paper, dry cardboard or dry timber on their domestic premises, between the hours of 10.00am and 3.00pm from Monday to Saturday.

The fire must not be lit before 10.00am and must be completely extinguished by 3.00pm. Burning is not permitted on Sunday or any Public Holiday.

It is important to ensure that the material being burnt is completely dry to ensure a quick, clean burn and therefore minimising the amount of smoke produced from the fire. The burning of damp, wet or green garden prunings, leaves or other material is not permitted.

Residential Areas

Council is involved in a township clearance program which starts around October each year, this involves inspection of township and some rural allotments, under the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 section 105F.

Council can issue a Section 105F notice if :

'a Council believes that the conditions on private land in a fire district are as such as to cause an unreasonable risk of the outbreak of fire on the land, or spread of fire through the land, due to the presence of flammable undergrowth or other flammable or combustible materials or substances'.

It is the Landowners responsibility to comply with the Act. Failure to comply with a notice will incur an expiation of \$473, plus the recovery cost of Council carrying out the work required by that notice.

It is recommended that property owners keep the height of grass on their property to a maximum height of 10 centimetres for the entire fire danger season.
