Do you have a glutton of fruit at different times of the year, and don't really know what to do with it all? Would you like to know how to preserve your own produce in a safe way for you and your family and friends to have for many months and possibly years free of chemicals?

Hello Tungkillo Community

Gardening group update to the community on the progress of the Tungkillo Native Food and Fire-Retardant Garden. The progress club was lucky enough to receive a \$1000 grant from Australia Post to start this wonderful project. As the committee, the Progress Club came up with the idea of this Native Food and Fire-Retardant Garden for all to use and wanting to show what plants grow that your family can eat in every day foods. The plants chosen are native to SA. Native garden plants typically grow well in the garden, having involved specifically to their region, climate and soil conditions, all of these points were taken in consideration when coming up with the idea. Native's require little water apart from the rain fall once established as well as little to no fertilizing. Many native plants can act as a fireretardant plant, if kept well maintain and in top condition. We also added a few native for their majestic colours. These also provide a great habitat, plus food and shelter for native birds, bees, insects as well as small animals, frogs and reptiles.

Specifically edible native plants have been used for centuries by the indigenous people of Australia as a food source, as well as used for medical purposes, and these plants also helped the first settlers fight off starvation to survive for they had no idea of our climate and our soil conditions when they first arrive in Australia.

Working at the last 3 working bees, the dedicated of a small group of locals have been busy removing and cleaning away the grass from the top of the tennis courts, along with digging holes, planting, and placing a watering system in, to start this project, so it can thrive though our hot summer.

Some of the plants have started to flower so hopefully the community can see it when they have fruited and pick and try some of their fruits and leaves. Hopefully in 2-3 years' time the plants will be thriving and there will be plenty of food for everyone to taste and enjoy. This is our goal.

Lilly pili Native lemon grass Native raspberry Native River mint Muntrie berries Seablite Hardenbergia (native lilac) Kangaroo paws Warragal greens Sticky hop bush Karkalla (Disphyma crassifolium) Wattles Correa **Ruby Saltbush** Native limes (3 types) Native Mint Native Celery Native Parsley Eremophila – many types Samphire Cap gum (native to the Mount Lofty ranges)





ONE NUMBER TO MAKE CONTACTING MID MURRAY COUNCIL FASTER, EASIER

Got an inquiry about your rubbish collection? Need to pay a Council bill? Want to report a wandering dog? Whatever the reason for calling, getting in touch with the Mid Murray Council will soon be even easier.

The Council is about to implement a one number telephone system – meaning no matter why you need to get in touch, it will be as simple as calling (08) 8569 0100 and following the easy-to-use numbered menu to get connected with the right department.

Mid Murray Council Chief Executive Officer, Ben Scales, said the goal of the new system was to improve each customer's experience by streamlining the process of contacting Council.

"By giving the community one number to call for all inquiries, it will make contacting the right person simpler and more convenient. The new system will also allow our customer service officers to handle a greater number of inquiries, and customers will be able to direct their own calls to the department best suited to their inquiry through the simple numbered menu system.

"Importantly, there will still be an option for callers to talk directly to customer service staff if they're unsure where to direct their inquiry."

On calling, customers will be greeted with a list of options and can select a number that is related to the purpose of their call. Their call will then be directed to the relevant department.

If a customer is unsure which option to select, or if they prefer to speak with a Customer Service Officer, they can choose the customer service option, or hold the line and the call will be answered by Council's experienced customer service team as per the current process.

Council's one number telephone system will commence on Tuesday, October 3.

Free Hard Waste Disposal Vouchers

2023/2024 Free Hard Waste Disposal Vouchers

In 2023/2024, Mid Murray Council will offer Free Hard Waste Disposal Vouchers to eligible ratepayers within the Mid Murray Council area.

Free Hard Waste Disposal Vouchers are eligible to non-commercial, residential properties only who receive a kerbside collection service/Transfer Station Access Card and allows ratepayers to dispose of two free level 8' x 5' trailer loads of waste to any of Mid Murray Council's Waste Transfer Station Facilities.

Hard rubbish, also known as hard waste, are your rubbish items that don't fit into or are not accepted in your general waste bins, including Household Furniture and Waste, Building Material and Green Waste.

Excluded Materials: Asbestos, Tyres, Mattresses/Ensembles and Contractor's Waste. These waste items attract additional charges and will be charged separately.

Free Hard Waste Disposal Vouchers will be available from 1 July 2023 and are by online application only. Terms and Conditions apply.

- 2 drops of tea tree oil


Defuse 30-60 minutes at a time alternatively place in a 10ml roller bottle and top with a carrier oil of your choice.

Fire Prevention is everyone's concern. Make sure you read this page. It covers the following Information:-

* Your Responsibility

* Bushfire Prevention

Did you know that as an owner of a property you have a duty to prevent the occurrence or spread of fire through land, whether you're a residential or rural block owner with a dwelling or even vacant land. This is part of the South Australian *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005* (Part 3 Division 8 and Part 4 Division 7 and 8).

The SA Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 (Country Fire Service part) states under Section 105F(1) that -

(1) An owner of private land must take reasonable steps-

(a) to prevent or inhibit the outbreak of fire on the land; and

- (b) to prevent or inhibit the spread of fire through the land; and
- (c) to protect property on the land from fire; and
- (d) to minimise the threat to human life from a fire on the land.


Maximum penalty: \$5,000.

Expiation fee: \$473

Throughout the year it is always time to look at measures that can be implemented for the protection of life and property through fire prevention measures.

Ensure that all flammable material are cleared from around dwellings;

rural properties ensuring proper land management principles are adhered to, to stop the spread of fire through their property while adhering to the Native Vegetation Act for fire breaks etc.

Bushfire Prevention

In the garden and around the home:

• Cut down grass and clear away any fallen branches, leaves and dead undergrowth within 20 metres of the home.

• Prune lower branches less than 1 metres above the ground to provide a vertical fuel break to help prevent ground fires from spreading into trees.

• Remove any mulch to at least 1 metre from any dwelling wall and move woodpiles away from the dwellings.

Ensure all gutters are kept clear of leaves and twigs.

Rural Living - On rural properties, prepare and maintain fuel breaks around fence lines, buildings, equipment sheds, haystacks, hay sheds and fuel supplies.

Fuel reduction on vacant allotments greater than 0.5 hectares in size. It is considered that a mowed or slashed firebreak be constructed around the perimeter of the block of land to the minimum width of 4m. The flammable growth on the firebreak is to be maintained to maximum height of 10cms for the duration of the fire danger season. However this is only a guide-line.

Residential Areas

Council is involved in a township clearance program which generally starts around October each year, this involves inspection of township and some rural allotments, under the South Australian *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005* section 105F.

Council can issue a Section 105F notice if :

'a Fire Prevention Officer of Council believes that the conditions on private land in a fire district are as such as to cause an unreasonable risk of the outbreak of fire on the land, or spread of fire through the land, due to the presence of flammable undergrowth or other flammable or combustible materials or substances'.

It is the Landowners responsibility to comply with the Act. Failure to comply with the general provisions of section 105F(1) or the failure to comply with a notice issued under section 105F(5) will incur an explaint notice of \$473, plus the recovery cost of Council carrying out the work required by that notice.

It is recommended that property owners keep the height of grass on their property to a maximum height of 10 centimetres for the entire fire danger season.

Please look up further information on the Mid Murray Council website. Everything you need to know should be there, if however it is not please ring the office and there will be someone that can help you.
