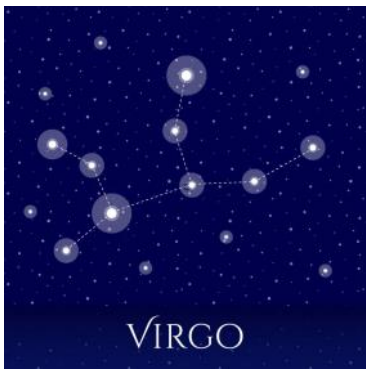

Chronicle (Adelaide, SA : 1895 - 1954), Saturday 9 September 1905, page 17

TUNGKILLO.

August 29. — Yesterday an old and respected resident. Mr. Rowland Sayer, died. He came to the State 49 years ago by the ship Omago. He worked in the Totness mill for a long time, then carried on butchering at Mount Pleasant, and afterwards kept the District Hotel, South Petherton. The deceased left three daughters— Mrs. J. S. Buckley, Mrs. J. Spry, of Tungkillo, and Mrs. R. Pike, of Eden Valley — 15 grandchildren, and nine greatgrandchildren.

August 28. — Arbor day was celebrated here on Friday last on the public school grounds, when a fair number of parents and friends attended. Upwards of 50 trees were planted by the children, and speeches were made by the teacher (Mr. Poulson), and Messrs. J. Naismith and A. B. Rollond. Refreshments were handed around to all by Mrs. Poulson. — The cemetery has undergone a thorough renovation, which was sadly needed.

Owners having furze growing on half-width of roads adjoining their property to be notified that if not grubbed by October 1 steps will be taken to destroy same. Rabbit inspector reported that the rabbits are now kept well under. Payments—General, £81 12s.3d.; main road, £154 10s. 2d.

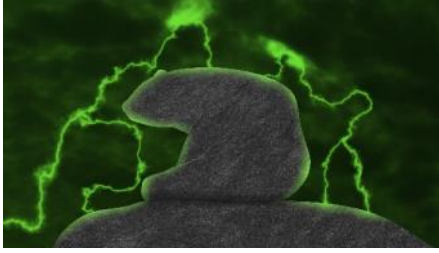

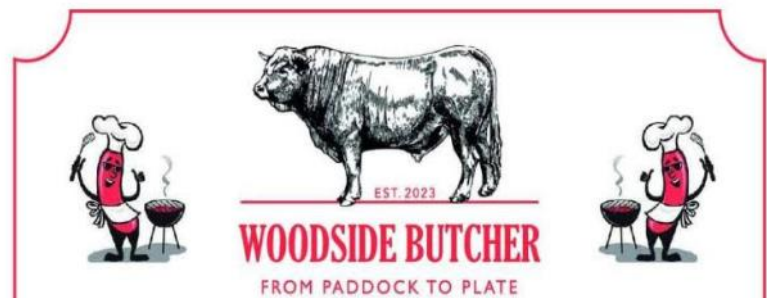

Bushfire Protection

In the garden and around the home:

- Cut down grass and clear away any fallen branches, leaves and dead undergrowth within 20 metres of the home.
- Prune lower branches less than 1 metres above the ground to provide a vertical fuel break to help prevent ground fires from spreading into trees.
- Remove any mulch to at least 1 metre from any dwelling wall and move woodpiles away from the dwellings.
- Ensure all gutters are kept clear of leaves and twigs.

Rural Living - On rural properties, prepare and maintain fuel breaks around fence lines, buildings, equipment sheds, haystacks, hay sheds and fuel supplies.

Fuel reduction on vacant allotments greater than 0.03 hectares in size. It is considered that a mowed or slashed firebreak be constructed around the perimeter of the block of land to the minimum width of 4m. The flammable growth on the firebreak is to be maintained to maximum height of 10cms for the duration of the fire danger season. However this is only a guideline.

Residential Areas

Council is involved in a township clearance program which starts around October each year, this involves inspection of township and some rural allotments, under the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 section 105F.

Council can issue a Section 105F notice if :

'a Council believes that the conditions on private land in a fire district are as such as to cause an unreasonable risk of the outbreak of fire on the land, or spread of fire through the land, due to the presence of flammable undergrowth or other flammable or combustible materials or substances'.

Warrigal greens *tetragonia tetragonioides*

Also known as Native Spinach – Botany Bay greens – New Zealand spinach

This bush food is a member of the family **Alzooaceae** and is related to marigolds and figs. Warrigal Greens grows naturally in all parts of Australia except the NT. Can be seen growing between rocks near beaches, sand dunes and in estuaries. Warrigal greens is a hardy plant which once established will thrive in many different soil conditions and different climate. The plant will die back in cold – frost prone areas so its easy to take cuttings or sow seeds. However, warrigal greens readily self-seed, so it's quite possible you will end up with plenty once the weather begins to warm up. This plant is fairly adaptable, tolerates a pH; 5.8 – 7.5 and in a range of different types of soil ranging from sandy to clay as long as it is a moist free draining soil likes full sun to part shade and can tolerate wind.

Warrigal greens is fairly disease and pest resistant plant but may occasionally be attacked by snails and slugs. This plant grows to 20 cm's height up to 2 metres in width in the correct conditions. Feeding this plant is not really necessary, but a little fertilising during the beginning of the start of the warmer season will nourish the soil while gently feeding the plant. Small green – yellow flowers appear in spring and summer followed by hard seed capsules. Leaves have a fleshy appearance covered in tiny hairs that give it an iridescent glow especially in direct sunlight. The leaves are edible and often used as a substitute for spinach or similar leafy greens.

The leaves are a diamond shape and contain a high level of oxalates which can be detrimental if eaten raw in large amounts, however blanching for 1 minute then drain and use in cooked dishes as you would with any leafy greens will easily remove the oxalates and make them perfectly suitable for human consumption. Use it as a substitute for silver beet or spinach or any recipe that call for leafy greens. Good in stir-fries,

Once established the leaves are ready to be harvested between 8-10 weeks, snip off the leaves as required for cooking. If you can't eat all your warrigal greens, they are a fabulous source of greens for your chickens. In a permaculture food forest, it makes a great living mulch to keep soil moisture levels and temperature consistent as well as keeping cats from digging in your garden. Use in your garden under shallow rooted trees such as citrus and avocados that don't like competition, as the warrigal green has a shallow root system. If your warrigal greens take over, because it has long trail stems which roots fairly easily it can become invasive (which can easily happen) and start to feel like a weed – simply recycle them in your garden. However, its enthusiastic spreading habits make it a good choice to cover problem areas and minimise weed growth. The plant has a trail habit and will form a thick carpet on the ground or climb through other vegetation. They break down quickly and make a great addition to your compost or worm farm, providing you with a nutrient rich fertiliser for your other plants.

Warrigal greens contain high levels of vitamin C, K and B6 as well as manganese. This bush tucker greens has been used as a spinach substitute, used by the first explorers and settlers to fight scurvy. It is unknown to what extent the First Nations people may have consumed this food, records don't acknowledge the aboriginals using this plant in their cooking, or for medicinal properties, although they have known to have been a part of the Maori cuisine.
