# **Lest We Forget**

### The Origin Of Our Most Honoured Day

ANZAC stands for the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps. This corps of soldiers landed at the Gallipoli Cove Peninsula in Turkey at dawn on the 25th April 1915 during the First World War which was fought from 1914 to 1918. It was a morning that saw thousands of troops land on a beach surrounded by sheer cliffs and guarded by the Turkish army. The ensuing battle resulted in thousands of allied casualties and by the end of 1915, allied forces were evacuated from the Turkish Peninsula after both sides had suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships. Over 8,000 Australian and New Zealand soldiers had been killed.

Originally recognising Australia and New Zealand's heroic stand at Gallipoli Cove in 1915, today ANZAC Day recognises the courageous achievements of all Australians who have served and died for their country during times of war, conflict and peace-keeping operations both here at home and overseas.

The spirit of ANZAC, with its human qualities of courage, mateship and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our

## Symbols of Remembrance

### The Dawn Service

Marks the time the first troops landed at Gallipoli - the most favoured time for an attack. Silence for one or two minutes is included in the ANZAC Day ceremony as a sign of respect and a time for reflection.

### Rosemary

Worn on the lapel for remembrance, rosemary is found growing wild on the Gallipoli peninsula.

### The Last Post

In military tradition, the Last Post is the bugle call that signifies the end of the day's activities. It is also sounded at military funerals to indicate that the soldier has gone to his final rest and at commemorative services such as ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day.

#### Two-up

This game involves a designated 'Spinner' who throws two pennies into the air. Players gamble on whether the coins will fall with both heads up, both tails up, or with one head and one tail (known as 'Odds'). It is traditionally played on ANZAC Day to mark a shared experience with the Diggers.

### **ANZAC Biscuits**

These were often sent to loved ones at the war front because the ingredients did not spoil and the biscuits kept well during naval transportation - which would take more

than two months.

### The Williamstown and District WW1 Memorial to our Fallen Soldiers

When is a rock not a rock? The answer to this is to be found outside the RSL Hall on Colonists Corner in Williamstown. Here there is a very proud piece of granite bearing a cast brass plate which elevates it from a common earth mixture to a symbol of heroism and sacrifice, a guardian of memories of loss and sorrow. It reminds us of the cost paid by the Williamstown and District Community for Freedom during WW1. It is part of our history. It is our Monument, our Memorial for our fallen soldiers.

In the May 2015 Issue of The Willy Wagtail much was written, and photos were shown, of this Memorial's Centenary ANZAC Day Dedication Ceremony. But before it reached this stage a great deal of hard work and time went into the Memorial's advent. While talking to Trevor Jessop, who, at the time of the Centenary, was a member of the Williamstown and Districts Historical Society and also the Treasurer/Secretary of the ANZAC Day Committee, I was captivated by his telling of the actual acquiring of 'the rock'!

While out exercising his little dog one day, Trevor was greeted by local identity, Ian Ross, who asked Trevor if he was "still looking for a rock?" Indeed, he was! After visiting many different types of Memorials, a rock had become the chosen medium, but finding a suitable one was proving a bit difficult. When Ian suggested getting one out of Blue Rock Quarry Trevor was more than happy with the suggestion but just a little taken aback when Ian rocked up not many days later accompanied by a Barossa Council Truck and Front End Loader, which, together with Ian's Ute, were parked near Trevor's house. Ian invited Trevor to "hop in and come with me!"

Up the Springton Road they went before turning in to the overgrown track that leads up to the old quarry. Ian was super organised with keys to all the gates and the little convoy wound their way up, up, up, to the area where the quarry used to be worked. (Rock from the Blue Rock Quarry was used to build the Reservoir Walls and the huge chunks would come down a Flying Fox arrangement to the waiting carts and work horses who would then pull their heavy loads to the building sites. The quarry closed in the early 1900's. More information on this fascinating period in Williamstown's history can be obtained by contacting The Williamstown and Districts Historical Society through Peter on 0427870594.)

Alighting from their vehicle Trevor was faced with a bit of a dilemma when Ian asked, "Right! Which one do you want?" There were boulders everywhere! Fortunately, Trevor saw one big rock which fulfilled the main requirement of having a big flat surface on one face. To his request, "Can I have this one?" there came a "Yep!" and the front-end loader swung into action, swinging the massive heavy rock into the air and manoeuvring it over the waiting truck, then lowering it carefully into it. Down they came on their return journey and, reaching the pre-prepared, selected site outside the RSL rooms, the truck tipped our rock off, the front-end loader came in and nosed it around into its correct position and then away the machines went. (Wondering what the near-by little rock is for? Insurance against the future!)

As soon as this Memorial process started Trevor felt it was as if "The Town had been waiting for it to happen!" Help was volunteered from many sources. The perimeter stonework was done by a few volunteers on a stinking hot day. After the original Rosemary plants donated by Wirraminna died, members of the Senior Citizens who noticed the 'sticks' standing up, went out, bought and planted new ones to replace them and, when asked about the shrubs which had a connection to Turkey, Gallipoli and the Anzacs, two Barossa Council workers voluntarily located, bought and planted two of them. The History Group did a great deal of research and compiled the list of fallen warriors to go on the plaque, which they organised, and which is affixed to the Memorial Rock's flat face. In addition, the Group contacted descendants of the Fallen and they were invited to the Dedication Ceremony to lay wreaths made by the History Group and other



willing volunteers. The Community Council volunteered a wonderful afternoon tea to follow the event. Left with just the ceremony to organise Trevor made it a Centenary Event to remember with his re-enactment group, the presence of His Excellency The Governor of SA, supported by two of our local lady volunteers, various other dignitaries including MPs, a light-horse man and military vehicle who all paraded from the Big Gum Tree on Memorial Drive.

From the tiny acorn of an idea the Williamstown Community seamlessly, and without prompting, came together and grew a wonderful oak. That Memorial, for me, will now always have the shadows of a community of amazing, generous, caring and proud volunteers standing around it. 'That Rock' stands for so much! LL.

### **Betronia Hill**

In 1989, after living in Cockatoo Valley and Two Wells, Beth and Ron Smart bought land on Adams Road in Williamstown, built a lovely home and, from a South Australian Nursery, purchased and planted 3,500 protea bushes so that they would have 'something to do when they retired'! After the initial four years of growing to establish themselves and mature, many of the proteas were shipped by an exporter overseas to places like Japan. When this wholesaler dropped the International Markets, he did, however, continue to send the Smart's flowers to his Interstate Markets in Victoria and Queensland. For 25 years Beth, who has also found time to paint appealing traditional landscapes and more recently engaging abstract pictures, had a Delivery Round, once a week, starting in Tea Tree Gully and covering many adjacent suburbs. This onerous service ceased only 3 years ago, which is amazing, considering both Beth and Ron have been amongst our esteemed Senior Citizens for quite a while now! The work, over the years, has been hard with long hours in the shed - stems needing to be cut to 3 different required lengths, blooms needing to be stored in the cool room until ready for transit, bunches to be made up. Outside, there is the picking of the flowers that can be at times 'difficult' and there is also the destruction of the kangaroos to deal with. Fortunately, most of the time, pruning occurs as the blooms part company with their parent plant.

Beth and Ron grow about four different species of spectacular proteas, an absolute gift of a flower originally from South Africa, as are the Leucadendron and the Leucospermum that they farm along with the lovely native Geraldton Wax. Things have changed a bit since the early days when they arrived with their horses and rode around a much smaller Williamstown. Their property which only had two trees on it is now well covered with trees and shrubs and although the proteas now number only 500 plants they are still hard work. Those of us who eagerly await the arrival of the buckets at the gate of number 19 Adams Road, are scoring a real bargain when we purchase the lovely bouquets from here. Beth and Ron are to be commended for their generosity towards their community. During the season, when the buckets are out, you know, if they are empty when you arrive a bit too late in the day, that come the morning they will be full of beautiful blooms once more. L.L.




### Williamstown Playgroup

The Barossa Local Drug Action Team or LDAT is funded by the Alcohol and Drug Foundation with a focus on undertaking primary prevention actions to prevent and minimise Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) harm in the Barossa.

We are in desperate need for new team members who are keen to help prevent and reduce AOD harm in our families. In particular we are seeking people with "lived experience" of AOD harm and retires looking to help in their community. "The authentic voice of lived experience can be powerful"

#### What do we do?

The latest Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC) - Australian National Waste Water Drug Monitoring Program and Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) reports have strengthened the LDAT's endeavour to pursue their AOD harm reduction effort in the Barossa and surrounding areas.

The March 2023 ACIC report identifies that regional South Australia is ranked first nationally in consumption of methylamphetamine (ICE), MDMA and fentanyl. Further, the latest ABS data (2021) shows that the death rate from excess alcohol use was the highest in the past 10 years.


